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**ELL C024N** **36 Hours (36 lecture hours)**

## **English Idioms and Contemporary Expressions - Beginning**

## **Integrated English Skills 1B**

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C011N Sentence Structure 1 with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course; Students who have completed ESL C012N Reading and Writing 1 with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course; Students who have completed ESL C013N Listening and Conversation 1 with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course; Students who have completed ESL C020N Integrated English Skills 1A with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course; New students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This is a basic course for high-beginning English language learners and focuses on English language skills necessary for reading, writing, listening, and speaking tasks in familiar everyday life situations. Emphasis is placed on interpreting short reading passages on familiar topics in everyday life in the United States as well as writing sentences in the simple past, past progressive, and future tenses. Students work to master pronunciation of final consonants, build listening skills to identify main idea and details, and speaking skills to ask for directions and clarification. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).

**ELL C040N** **48-144 Hours (48-144 lecture hours)**

## **Integrated English Skills 2A**

**Advisory:** Students who have completed ESL C022N Reading, Writing, and Grammar 1B with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course; Students who have completed ESL C023N Speaking and Listening 1B with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course; Students who have completed ESL C030N Integrated English Skills 1B with a Pass are encouraged to enroll in this course; New students are advised to complete the ESL placement process to determine their initial placement.

**Grading Mode:** P/NP/SP Noncredit  
Not Transferable.

This is a course for low-intermediate English language learners and focuses on English language skills necessary for reading, writing, listening, and speaking tasks in familiar everyday life situations. Emphasis is placed on reading and interpreting short reading passages, using a variety of present, past, and future tenses, writing short paragraphs, accurate pronunciation and communication, and listening skills necessary for classroom situations and life skills. (NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE).
