Assessment — The current law (AB 705) requires community colleges to maximize the probability that a student will enter and complete transfer-level coursework in English and math within a one-year timeframe. In compliance with the law, Coastline College no longer requires or provides placement testing for English and math courses. Students have the right to enroll in transfer-level courses or credit-based ESL courses without a placement test. Counselors will help students determine which English, math, or ESL course and any necessary support courses is best for them.

Associated Student Government (ASG) — The Associated Student Government (ASG) is recognized as the official Student Governing Body within Coastline College and serves as the student voice within the participatory governance process. ASG provides opportunities to learn about governance, advocacy, leadership, and event planning.
