Course Description

This course is an introduction to the fundamentals of Mexican Folklórico dance. Folklore passes down through generations, stories, experiences, and, in Mexico, through dance. The focus of this course is on the movement techniques, forms, and the regional and historical background of dances from various states and regions of Mexico. Transfer Credit: CSU; UC.

- Perform beginning level movements and rhythmic patterns of various Mexican folk dances.
- Identify and analyze historical and cultural factors of various Mexican folk dances.

Course Objectives

- · 2. Demonstrate basic technical skills of various Mexican folk dances
- 3. Understand and articulate in written form the historical and cultural context of Mexican folk dances of various regions
- 4. Identify and embody the variations in movement vocabulary used in dances of different regions
- 5. Identify the variations in music, regalia, and props used to represent dances of different regions
- 6. Perform at a basic level- different Mexican folk dances

Lecture Content

Orientation Procedures and requirements History and origin of Mexican Folklórico dance General characteristics of Mexican dances as differentiated from other national folk dances History of geographical location and regional influences Culture and origin of music, dress, and props representing specific Mexican states and regions. Self-evaluation Written critiques

Lab Content

Learn basic dance vocabulary common to various styles of Mexican Folklórico. Learn rhythmic patterns. Learn floor patterns. Learn the specific uses of torso, arms and head. Learn specific footwork common to various styles of Mexican Folklórico. Learn the use of regional costumes and/or props in various styles of Mexican Folklórico. Learn choreography for specific Mexican Folklórico dances.

Method(s) of Instruction

Instructional Techniques

Lecture and discussion; demonstrations; participation and group practice; Viewing of videos and live dance concerts; written assignments; skills evaluation.

Reading Assignments

Reading of historical essays/ articles for discussion or written reflection as assigned by instructor.

Writing Assignments

Reading of historical essays/ articles for written reflection as assigned by instructor. Written Dance critiques on recorded or live performances.

Out-of-class Assignments

Viewing of films/ videos and reading of historical essays/ articles assigned by instructor.

Demonstration of Critical Thinking

Written test(s) based on lectures, discussion, and reading assignments. Skills demonstrations. Completions of written assignments- reflections and /or concert critiques. Participation and attendance to embody the principals of the art form.

Required Writing, Problem Solving, Skills Demonstration

Written dance critique on recorded or live performance.
