Students will produce programs designed for live and live to tape television formats in the Film/Video Department's digital television studio, utilizing 16 x 9 widescreen cameras, switchers, lighting, and sound recording equipment. Each student will be assigned projects to produce and will experience all major functions of the production team. PREREQUISITE: FILM A155. Transfer Credit: CSU.
