Students will have outside assignments in the preparation and evaluation of work for their exhibitions as well as in the sequencing of exhibition

Demonstration of Critical Thinking

Students will demonstrate critical thinking skills in evaluating and editing the work to be included in their exhibition as well as in sequencing the project.

Required Writing, Problem Solving, Skills Demonstration

Practical skills, along with the ability to select and use the appropriate tools will be acquired and demonstrated during the hanging of their exhibition. The student will write and produce promotional materials for their exhibition.
