Tutoring skills development in the areas of interpersonal and communication skills, learning styles, study skills techniques, diversity/cultural awareness, and Socratic method. One of a sequence of courses leading to a Certificate of Completion in Tutoring Skills and Strategies. Noncredit. NOT DEGREE APPLICABLE. Not Transferable.
