Course Description

VIET C285 is a continuation of VIET C280 with continuing emphasis on student's ability to comprehend and converse in daily spoken Vietnamese at the advanced intermediate level. The course focuses on enriching the communication skills in formal and familiar ways of speaking, reading, using correct grammar, spelling, vocabulary building, and composing. The course explores culture through readings, plays, and film. PREREQUISITE: VIET C280 or VIET C280B or equivalent competency. Transfer Credit: CSU; UC.

Course Level Student Learning Outcome(s)

1. Demonstrate ability to respond orally and in writing in two dialects in advanced intermediate level on a variety of topics.
2. Demonstrate knowledge of unique cultural aspects of the Vietnamese-speaking people at the advanced intermediate-level in spoken and written Vietnamese.

Course Objectives

- 1. Interpret and produce intermediate-level spoken and written Vietnamese formulated by native speakers and compose and construct oral and written responses.

- 2. Compare and contrast various aspects of the cultures, beliefs, and world views of the peoples of Vietnamese-speaking countries and regions with those of the United States

Method(s) of Instruction

Instructional Techniques

A variety of activities, (including lecture employing current technology and/or handouts, video and/or audio presentations, pair and group work) will be employed. Intensive and extensive listening and reading in the target language is directed toward raising learners awareness of the lexical nature of language. Activities will be structured to enable the learners to comprehend lexical phrases as unanalyzed "chunks" and to use whole phrases without necessarily having to analyze their constituent parts.

Out-of-class Assignments

Homework assignments to test comprehension of vocabulary grammar written materials culture and history of Vietnam

Demonstration of Critical Thinking

Compare and contrast cultural practices, history, geography, and cultural diversity in Vietnam with those of the United States.

Required Writing, Problem Solving, Skills Demonstration

Pairs or groups will engage in conversation in intermediate level Vietnamese to a task which involves role-playing on a variety of topics chosen by the instructor to simulate real-life situations.
