

SOCIAL WORK/HUMAN SERVICES (SWHS)

SWHS G110 **3 Units (54 lecture hours)**

Introduction to Social Work and Human Services

Advisory: ENGL G100 or ENGL G100S.

Grading Mode: Standard Letter

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC.

Formerly: SWHS G100. This course is an introductory overview of social welfare in the U.S. and the societal institutions that structure the provision of social services and services to individuals and groups. The course covers the historical perspectives of U.S. social work and human services structures, with emphasis on the evolution of social welfare programs and institutions, major U.S. court and policy decisions, contemporary social problems, and modern service delivery systems. Further exploration of current policies, procedures, and the tasks of culturally responsive social workers and human service workers is also covered. Students will explore professional, ethical, and cultural issues facing the fields of social work and human services. Graded.

SWHS G120 **1 Unit (18 lecture hours)**

Seminar in Social Work and Human Services

Prerequisite(s): SWHS G110.

Co-requisite(s): SWHS G121.

Grading Mode: Standard Letter, Pass/No Pass

Transfer Credit: CSU.

Formerly: SWHS G200. This course will emphasize professional ethical standards, self-awareness and self-esteem, interviewing and communication skills, the relationship of theory and practice, and organization and client systems within human services. With concurrent enrollment in the fieldwork course and through professional development guidance, students will acquire and practice employable skills, competencies, and professional qualities needed for future employment. Graded.

SWHS G121 **2 Units (108 other hours)**

Fieldwork in Social Work and Human Services

Prerequisite(s): SWHS G110.

Co-requisite(s): SWHS G120.

Grading Mode: Standard Letter

Transfer Credit: CSU.

This course is designed to facilitate a supervised field experience within a human services community organization, agency, or institution. Students will be able to connect theory-to practice through observation and practical experience, as well as develop new skills outside of the classroom environment in preparation for gaining employment in the human services field. The student will be required to document 108 hours of supervised field experience within a human services environment. Graded.
