The Associate of Arts in World Language Degree develops student's critical thinking, analytical, and communicative skills while providing a basis for understanding cultures and languages, thus preparing graduates for many careers in a multicultural world where communication is vital in our growing global interdependence and technological connectivity. Students enrolled in the program prepare for transfer education and/or careers in areas including but not limited to: education, health care, public safety, law, business, international business, diplomatic services, international relations, anthropology, economics, political science, sociology, literature, linguistics, interpreting, translation, teaching, research, public relations, international commerce, tourism, hospitality, journalism, publishing, media, advertising, broadcasting, film, and consulting. The World Language Associate of Arts is comprised of multiple world languages, from beginning to advanced, meant to build students' language acquisition in a language other than English. Students can select the language combination they wish to study. All courses are designed to develop the students' listening comprehension, speaking, reading, writing and/or signing skills as well as to provide a general overview of various civilizations and cultures related to world languages.
