The Social Work and Human Services Associate of Arts for Transfer is designed for students seeking to enter helping professions, local county and state agencies, non-profit organizations, and private providers of service. This program is appropriate for individuals seeking entry-level positions as behavior management aides, child advocates, child care workers, and group counselors. The degree is also a pathway to four-year university bachelor's degree in social work, human services, or a related field. The program allows for students to gain foundational theoretical knowledge and practical experience to prepare for advanced study in fields that serve the general population in social welfare settings. Students completing this degree will be well prepared for entry level positions in social welfare, behavioral therapy, and social work, and advanced training and education in social work, counseling, therapy, or work within related medical personnel fields.

Program Level Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this program, students will be able to:

1. Apply theoretical perspectives, legal and ethical principles, and social issues related to client populations within Social Work and Human Services fields.
2. Develop professional skills and cultural competencies as a foundation for success in the fields of Social Work and Human Services.
3. Analyze societal factors that create and contribute to social service needs.

Associate Degree for Transfer Graduation Requirements

Associate Degrees for Transfer require students to meet the following requirements:

- Completion of 60 semester units or 90 quarter units of degree-applicable courses,
- Minimum overall grade point average of 2.0,
- Minimum grade of "C" (or "P") for each course in the major, and
- Completion of IGETC and/or CSU GE-Breadth.

Students should consult a GWC counselor in order to select the best pathway to meet their educational goals. For students who intend to transfer, the choice of general education will be specific to both their major and transfer institution.
