OCC offers a broad and diverse portfolio of rigorous and innovative career and technical education certificate and degree programs to prepare students for entry or advancement in high-wage careers in healthcare, industrial technology and trades, digital and commercial art, business, IT, interior and fashion design, and more. Many degree and certificate programs can be completed in two years or less. Some programs offer short-term job training that lead directly to entry-level jobs. Counselors help students map out a plan to get the education and skill they need in the minimum amount of time. OCC Career Education programs can be completed at a fraction of the cost of similar training at private and for-profit institutions. Internship and Work Experience

An internship is a short-term job experience that gives you the opportunity to gain entry-level exposure and learn "on the job" about a particular industry or career field. Interns make industry connections, develop their career-readiness skills and knowledge, and build a professional network that can provide an on-ramp to full-time jobs in the future. Internships can be either paid or unpaid. Students can also earn course credit for internships through the OCC **Internship Experience class.**

Students who enroll in the **Internship Experience class** not only get course credit but also benefit from personal guidance and mentoring provided by a faculty member "expert" in that field and career preparation guidance from the internship course instructor. The Internship Academy complies with Title 5 regulations for accredited field experience.
